Mission Report

Brethren,

We are writing this report to apprise you of the progress of our missionary labors in the country of Zimbabwe. As you know the City View Baptist Church has undertaken a Church planting work in this country and has the responsibility in sustaining and supporting this ministry

This summer we had four others from our local church with us for two weeks out of the three months spent there primarily to assist in annual vacation bible school and conference. The VBS attracted about three hundred children ranging from 5 to 18 years old; evangelistic meetings were held each night of the conference which began on a Thursday and concluded the Lord's Day with a regular worship service.

Life in Zimbabwe was much better this year than the past four years; food, fuel and transportation is available, the currency being used is the US dollar mainly, and the SA rand. The moral of the people seems much higher and the city of Harare is vibrant and lively with business.

We were encourage to see a measure of fruit from our labors and have identified two brothers that we are eying for possible elders, one in the village of Murehewa fifty miles north east of Harare, and the other who lives in Harare, one of these men was influenced by Peter Masters of the Metropolitan Tabernacle in London and seems very enthusiastic about being established in sound biblical teaching.

Funerals are a regular occurrence in Zimbabwe and I officiated at two and witnessed three others, most people have no biblical understanding of death and life after death, at one occasion I was abruptly asked to speak at a funeral that was going on while we were visiting in Murehewa.

Benevolence is a vital part of our ministry as many people live on a day to day basis, common aspirin is out of reach for many in rural districts, many children can not go to school because they have no uniform, exercise books or school fees which is a mere \$20.00 a term in the rural area, we did as much as we could.

This is a brief snap shot of what transpired over the summer months, it is often sad to leave such a great need; we are thankful for those who participated by giving materials and finances, but most of all we are thankful for your prayers and were touch to hear how many prayed for this labor of love; continue to pray for:

- 1) That God would nature those two men whom we have identified
- 2) That there will be unity among the brethren
- 3) That God would bless the country with a fruitful harvest
- 4) For stability in the current government
